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Preface

This volume contains the revised accepted papers from among those submitted at the First Workshop on Personalised Multilingual Hypertext Retrieval (PMHR 2011)¹, held in conjunction with the ACM Hypertext 2011 (HT2011) Conference² at Eindhoven, The Netherlands, on 6 June 2011.

The workshop was designed to deal with two main aims:

- To set the scene in a challenging area for multilingual hypertext retrieval, allowing researchers with different approaches, and coming from different communities but engaged in related research topics, to meet and to determine a program of actions to undertake;
- To set up a strategy to follow for the evaluation of PMHR systems, so to define the collection of hypertext documents to use to evaluate such type of systems together with the metrics to use.

The workshop results will be of use in the design of personalised tools that can help end-users fully benefit from the use of distributed multilingual hypertext content.

The volume also contains the reports on the two invited presentations and on related relevant European projects and initiatives. Here we would like to thank those institutions and individuals who have made this workshop possible: the ACM Hypertext 2011 Conference, and in particular Martin Atzmüller (University of Kassel - DE) and Mykola Pechenizkiy (Eindhoven University of Technology - NL) that in their role of ACM Hypertext 2011 Conference Workshops and Tutorials Chairs have supported us with their critical comments and suggestions, and the Program Committee
